

Algeria, 1516. The pirate Aroudj Barbarossa frees Algiers from the tyranny of the Spanish and seizes power over the kingdom. Rumor has it he murdered King Salim Toumi despite their alliance. Against all odds, one woman will stand up to him: Queen Zaphira. Between history and legend, this woman's journey tells of a struggle, of personal and political turmoil endured for the sake of Algiers.

Damien Ounouri is an Algerian-French director based in Algiers. He studied cinema theory, developing its practical application as a self-taught skill. Adila Bendimerad is an Algerian actress, scriptwriter, and producer. As an actress she has worked with renowned Middle Eastern directors including Merzak Allouache and Georges Hachem. In 2011, she founded the production company Taj Intaj aiming to promote young Algerian talents. After his documentary **Fidaï** (TIFF, 2012), Ounouri directed the short film **Kindil El Bahr** cowritten with Bendimerad and produced by Taj Intaj (Cannes Directors' Fortnight, 2016). **The Last Queen** is the duo's directorial debut.

As construction slowly resumes, they start looking into this mysterious case. When the event repeats itself, the investigation takes a puzzling turn.

Youssef Chebbi was born in Tunisia in 1984. After studying art, he directed two short films, **Vers le Nord** and **Les Profondeurs** selected in several international festivals. In 2012 he codirected a documentary **Babylon** which won the Jury Prize at the FID of Marseille and was presented at MoMA. **Ashkal** is his first feature film.

Antoine and Christian, two long-estranged brothers from Normandy, couldn't be more different from each other: while the former is happily married with two kids and a successful boat driver, the latter is a facetious globe-trotting hustler who likes to engage in bar fights. But when Antoine starts getting involved in sleazy activities, Christian flies to his rescue. In an unexpected bonding-adventure they take upon themselves to defend the family they thought they'd never be.

Graduated from La Fémis in 2019, Julien Guetta directed several short films such as **Le Vacant** selected in Competition in Clermont-Ferrand in 2011. After co-signing scripts for long features and winning of the Emergence and Anger Workshop in 2017, he wrote and directed his first feature film **The Troubleshooter** starring Eric Judor and Laure Calamy which was acclaimed by the critics. **Top Dogs**, his second feature with Jean-Paul Rouve **(Les Tuche)** and Grégoire Ludig **(Mandibles)**, is produced by Nolita.

The Wild One By Tessa Louise-Salomé

An innovative, cinematic exploration of acting as a form of survival, through the life and work of Jack Garfein: Holocaust survivor, Actors Studio cofounder, controversial stage and screen director. A journey of an enigmatic, censored artist, *The Wild One* explores the importance of his legacy and questions how art can draw on personal memory to better enlighten our present.

Tessa Louise-Salomé is a screenwriter, director and producer for Petite Maison Production which she founded in 2006. An artist-portraying specialist, she has directed or worked on several documentaries focusing on the art world. Her first feature-length documentary **Mr. X**, a portrait of French filmmaker Leos Carax; caught the attention of Sundance Film Festival where it premiered in 2014.

Hayat, an expert sailor in the Arctic, navigates far from humans and her family's past in France. But when her little sister Leila gives birth to a baby girl, their worlds are turned upside down; we witness their journey, guided by the polar star, to overcome the family's fate.

Ainara Vera was born in Spain in 1985. After studying cinema, her first short documentary **Sertres** premiered at Locarno in 2014. She then directed a mediumlength film **See you tomorrow, God Willing!** which premiered at IDFA and was selected in many festivals including Doc NYC, DocsBarcelona. **Polaris** is her first feature doc.

We, Students! • By Rafiki Fariala



"A warm and insightful documentary about friendship and the situation of students at the University of Bangui" **Cincuropa**

Nestor, Aaron, Benjamin and Rafiki are economics undergraduates at the University of Bangui. Navigating between the overcrowded classrooms, the petty trades that allow students to survive, bribery lurking everywhere, Rafiki shows us what students lives are like in the Central African Republic, a shattered society where the youth keeps dreaming for a brighter future for their country.

Born in 1997 in DRC, Rafiki Fariala arrived early in the Central African Republic where his parents took refuge because of the war. Entirely self-taught, he started developing his voice and composing music early on and is now one of the promising figures of Bangui's musical scene under the pseudonym RAFIKI - RH20. At a workshop, he directed his first film, **Mbi na Mo**, which was selected at the Biarritz FIPADOC and many other festivals.

• Bambi, a French Woman By Sébastien Lifshitz – DIRECTOR'S CUT

From the day she was born in Algiers, Marie-Pierre has always wanted to wear dresses and has stubbornly refused her given name: Jean-Pierre.

At the age of 17, her life takes a major turn when she comes upon a drag show on tour: *le Carrousel de Paris*. Marie-Pierre becomes *Bambi*, and within a few years establishes herself as a legendary figure of the Parisian cabaret scenes of the 50s and 60s. By collecting the story of one of the first transgender women, Sebastien Lifshitz continues his work initiated with *Wild Side* and *Little Girl* and portraits a forceful personality.

This updated version of the film extends and deepens the short-film released in 2013 to become the feature-length version the director has always dreamt of making.



Too Close to the Sun • By Brieuc Carnaille

When he leaves the hospital, 30-something Basile moves in with his younger sister and closest confidant, Sarah. Living with a psychiatric disorder, Basile tries his best to re-establish a sense of stability in both his work and his love life. But, whilst hiding his illness from his new relatives, how long can he maintain this fragile stability?

Brieuc Carnaille is a French screenwriter and director. He is also a singersongwriter for the rock band Duel. In 2020, he directed his first feature-length film, **Too Close to the Sun**, following a pivotal encounter with actor Clément Roussier, for whom he wrote the lead role.

Anne-Laure Daffis and Leo Marchand both graduated in plastic arts from the Sorbonne University and started directing their first movies together, two shorts and a documentary, before moving on to animation. They have been working together ever since and **My Neighbors' Neighbors** is their first feature film.

Ziné and Avdal are madly in love in spite of their families' ancestral feud. When both parties finally set aside their differences and agree to their children getting married, Avdal is injured at the front and his inability to perform sexually casts a shadow over the wedding night. As this revives the family tensions, the newlyweds start exploring new forms of pleasure. Will their love overcome decades of conflict and tradition?




Paradise •

Siberia. In a small remote village near the Taiga - the largest forest in the world. It is summer and an abnormal heat has hit the Arctic region. The sky is veiled with thick clouds of smoke. The ashes spread worrying news to the village: The Taiga is on fire. Flames are approaching.

Alexander Abaturov was born in Russia in 1984. After graduating from Gorki University, he became a journalist. In 2010, he received a Masters degree from the French documentary School in Lussas. In 2013, he directed his first documentary, **Sleeping Souls**, selected in numerous festivals and awarded with the Institut Français Prize at the Cinéma du Réel Festival. **The Son**, his first feature length documentary, premiered in the Berlinale Forum and selected at many other festivals such as ArtDocFest, Message to Men, Cinéma du Réel, and several others.



• The Lost Souls of Syria By Stéphane Malterre & Garance Le Caisne

Stolen from the Syrian regime's secret archives, 27000 photos showing bodies of civilians detainees tortured to death are made public by a military defector codenamed Caesar. Who are the dead, what was their fate, why have they disappeared in Bachar Al Assad's prisons? All across Europe, victims' families, helped by international lawyers, activists and Caesar himself, seek for truth and justice, investigating the Syrian death machine and its highest officials. But torn between western governments' political agenda and the ongoing terror spread by Damascus dictatorship, how far will they go?

Stéphane Malterre and Garance Le Caisne are French journalists who both studied Syria in their respective previous works. While Malterre made a dozen documentaries for TV, the latest of which having been filmed in Syria for three years and premiering at Fipadoc, this is Le Caisne's first feature documentary after working on the Syrian regime's crimes for ten years.

She's mostly known for her role in **The Broken Circle Breakdown**, directed by Felix Van Groeningen which grabbed an Oscar nomination in 2014 and won the César award for Best Foreign Film. She was also the lead actress in Edouard Bergeon's film **In the Name of the Land** (2019). **When it melts**, adapted from a bestseller by Lize Spit, is her directorial debut.

Phuttiphong Aroonpheng studied fine arts at Bangkok's Silpakorn University. His 2015 short Ferris Wheel won many awards on the festival circuit. He also works extensively as a DoP, with credits including Vanishing Point and Anatomy of Time, directed by fellow Thai filmmaker Jakrawal Nilthamrong. His debut feature film Manta Ray won the Orizzonti Award for Best Film at the 2018 Venice FF.

The international success of the film Das Boot by Wolfgang Petersen made the U-96 one of the most famous submarines in cinematic history. But the true story of one of Hitler's most fearsome U-boats and its crew goes far beyond fiction. For the first time, this documentary sheds light on the reality behind the fiction through exclusive interviews with the makers and actors of Das Boot, as well as the last survivors of the time. In doing so, this documentary explores how Hitler's propaganda images may have influenced the visual and narrative force of Das Boot.
