That hot summer, as the 2-year anniversary of his wife's passing approaches, he realizes he just can't "shake it off." As his mental health deteriorates, he discovers a new connection with his once estranged son. Can Demba recover from his loss without losing himself?

Mamadou Dia is a Senegalese writer/director. His first feature Baamum Nafi/Nafi's Father (2019) is Senegal's Oscar entry for 2021 and has won many awards, including two Golden Leopards for First Feature and "Filmmakers of the Present" at the Locarno International Film Festival. The film was also selected for MoMA/Lincoln Center's 2020 New Directors/New Films, the 2019 TIFF Talent Lab and the 2018 Hubert Bals writing grant. Dia's short film Samedi Cinema premiered at the Venice and Toronto International Film Festivals in 2016 and received dozens of awards. Dia is co-founder of the production company Joyedidi, which organizes mobile screenings across Senegal. Mamadou is a 2023 Guggenheim Fellow.







Bouchra, raised in a mausoleum dedicated to the saint Sidi Sardi, is confronted by a hostile imam who wants to turn her family home into a mosque. Her life is turned upside down when she meets Ahmed, a cameraman willing to help her make a film about the saint. This project plunges her into a captivating investigation, a saga through Tunisia and the 20th Century, that will shake her deeply-rooted beliefs. An initiation to love, myths and cinema.

Tunisian director Kaouther Ben Hania constantly explores the boundaries between fiction and documentary. Her latest film, Four Daughters, is nominated for the Best Documentary Academy Award® 2024 after being presented in Competition at the Cannes Film Festival. The film received numerous prestigious awards and was sold in over 40 territories. Her previous film The Man Who Sold His Skin was also nominated at the Academy Awards® for Best International Feature Film in 2021, representing Tunisia. Her film Beauty and The Dogs premiered at the Cannes Film Festival's Un Certain Regard section in 2017. All her other films have premiered at prestigious festivals including: Cannes, Venice, AFI, Los Angeles, Locarno, IDFA, Hot Docs Toronto. You Shall Not Make an Image will be her fifth film, scheduled to start shooting in Summer/Fall 2024.



Facing Darkness

The Siege of Sarajevo lasted from April 1992 to February 1996. Young men were called up to protect their city, a few of them chose to take along their cameras to face the violence they witnessed throughout those grueling 1,425 days. Now, 30 years later, they show us their films and share their wartime filming experiences and thoughts on cinema as a means of survival and resistance.

Born in France in 1974, Jean-Gabriel Périot has made many short films on the edge of documentary, experimental and fiction. He has developed his own editing style that questions violence and history, based on film and photographic archives material. His first feature film, A German Youth opened the Panorama section at the 2015 Berlinale, before being released in German, Swiss and French cinemas. Summer Lights, his first feature-length fiction film, premiered at the San Sebastian Film Festival. Our Defeats premiered at the Forum of the 2019 Berlinale. His latest feature film, Returning to Reims was presented at the Directors' Fortnight in Cannes in 2021. The film won the Best Documentary César Award in 2023.
