From *Brazil* to *The Man Who Killed Don Quixote*, with an enthusiastic nod to the *Monty Python* saga, from his box office flops to the movies he never got to make, Terry Gilliam holds an outsized and legendary place in motion-picture history.

The European Union is a constantly challenged system, starting with the question of language. With 24 languages represented, how to speak with one voice? Shielded from public view in small caulked booths, European interpreters witness on a daily basis all major current challenges in international negotiations.

The Diplomats of the Shadows is a reflection of the cultural and linguistic diversity essential to the proper functioning of the European Union's democratic system, which has no equivalent in the world.

From the war in Ukraine to the energy crisis, and the migration policy, this film takes us into the current geopolitical issues through the lens of European interpreters.

In this immersive experience within the European institutions, the director raises a fundamental question: in these times of upheaval, how to preserve unity in diversity, the very essence of the European construction?

In the 1950s, the young determined MP Maria Jaszczuk managed to pass a law recognizing the right to abortion. Poland became a pioneering country in Europe and a source of hope for many women living on the other side of the Iron Curtain. But since 2021, abortion has been nearly completely banned in the country. How to explain this total shift in only half a century? Paradoxically, it was Solidarity's rise to power that reversed the course of events. Their alliance with the Church, vital to the success of their democratic movement against communism, came with strings attached. Abortion was progressively restricted starting in 1989. By telling this story, the film shows how reproductive rights have constantly been held hostage by politics, at women's expense.




WOMEN OF SCIENCE - THESE WOMEN WHO CHANGE OUR LIVES DV CAELA VESCAS

A lyrical tapestry of a place and people, *King Coal* meditates on the complex history and future of the coal industry, the communities it has shaped, and the myths it has created. Oscar®-nominated filmmaker Elaine McMillion Sheldon reshapes the boundaries of documentary filmmaking in a spectacularly beautiful and deeply moving immersion into Central Appalachia where coal is not just a resource, but a way of life, imagining the ways a community can re-envision itself.

While deeply situated in the regions under the reign of King Coal, where McMillion Sheldon has lived and worked her entire life, the film transcends time and place, emphasizing the ways in which all are connected through an immersive mosaic of belonging, ritual, and imagination. Emerging from the long shadows of the coal mines, *King Coal* untangles the pain from the beauty, and illuminates the innately human capacity for change.

HISTORY

Few people know that before the infamous Vel d'Hiv Roundup, the French government committed other similar raids. The first one, the 'Green Ticket Roundup' perpetrated in 1941, was a turning point in the deportation of Jews during WWII. 80 years after, this largely forgotten event resurfaces, as a hundred photos taken by the German propaganda services have just been found. Looking back at this dark day, during which 3,700 Jews were arrested before being transferred to Auschwitz camp, this investigation will reveal the origin of these images. How were these pictures, the only ones showing the roundups, discovered? Who is their renowned photographer?

KEIKO KISHI, ETERNALLY REBELLIOUS •

Born in 1932, Keiko Kishi has been one of the first Japanese actresses known worldwide. Her decision to move to France and to marry director Yves Ciampi in 1957 – after he filmed her in *Typhoon Over Nagasaki* starring Jean Marais and Danielle Darrieux – caused a huge scandal in Japan.

Despite this transgression, Keiko Kishi continued acting in her home country with Kon Ichikawa, Yasujiro Ozu, Masaki Kobayashi... building unique bridges between Japanese and European cultures. Free and rebellious, she emancipated herself from the many obstacles she encountered in the film industry, and created her own production company in her early twenties.

Let's look back at the story of a pioneer, an inspiration for many generations.

Between 1967 and 1976, Goliarda Sapienza wrote *The Art of Joy*, a subversive fresque set in her 20th Century Italy. The dazzling social rise of its rebellious heroine, Modesta, from her miserable childhood in Sicily to the upper worlds of the aristocratie reveals a sharp and emancipated bisexual character who stands up against all systems of domination – the Church, fascism, the mafia, patriarchy... Too outrageous to be published at the time, the novel left its author to die in poverty and anonymity.

100 years after Goliarda Sapienza's birth, this documentary sheds an unprecedented light on this cursed but nonetheless empowering masterpiece.



With the advent of smartphones and social media, the demonstration of first love excitement has changed drastically in recent decades. The first kiss is no longer a rite of passage, but is gradually replaced by foreplay: caresses, touching, fellatio, cunnilingus... All these gestures of affection and seduction shape the codes of a "new love order" of the 21st Century, shaping societal norms as we know them. By giving voice to the "real experts" concerned with the issue - teenagers and young people aged 12 to 23 - this tender documentary offers us a realistic portrait of today's sexualities, opening up discussions about respectful relationships.





MOTHERSHIP BY MURIEL CRAVATTE

In the middle of the Mediterranean Sea, the crew of the Ocean Viking is rescuing people in exile fleeing Libya, crammed in unseaworthy boats. Once rescued and welcomed on board, survivors receive first aid, then accompanied to a safe port. On this ship, like a refuge within a refuge, the Women's Shelter is a listening and care center for women and children.

To ensure that people in distress are rescued in compliance with human rights and maritime law, a tug-of-war between authorities and humanitarian aid workers occurs on a daily basis.




