Tommaso Usberti (1989) is an Italian-French director based in Paris. His short film *Deux égarés sont morts* won the Cinéfondation Third Prize at Cannes 2017, and in 2019 he was selected for La Résidence de la Cinéfondation. *Prima della Guerra* is his first feature. Raised in Piadena, Italy, he moved to Paris for his studies and now works between Italy and France.

REHEARSALS FOR A REVOLUTION

BY PEGAH AHANGARANI

Through five portraits of relatives and mentors, five expressions of resistance, Pegah Ahangarani sketches her life story. Drawing from personal archives, home videos, street protests footage, newspapers, and recorded voices, she retraces more than 40 years of Iran's history. From the early days of 1979, until the war that began in 2026, she pieces together intimate and collective memories, forming the portrait of a country shaped by political repression and in constant hope for a revolution.

Born in Iran in 1984 and currently based in London, Pegah Ahangarani is an award-winning Iranian filmmaker and actress. Her short documentaries *I Am Trying To Remember* (IDFA 2021), *My Father* (IDFA 2023), and *As I Lay Dying* (opening short IDFA 2025) have been selected and awarded in major international festivals including Hot Docs, Busan, the IDA Documentary Awards, Melbourne, among others. She also directed two TV documentaries: *Child Soldier* (BBC World, 2024) and *Taraneh* (BBC World, 2025). *Rehearsals For A Revolution* is her first feature documentary and she is currently developing her next feature film.

CONGO BOY

BY RAFIKI FARIALA

Bangui, Central African Republic. 17 year-old Robert dreams of a career in music, but civil war is tearing the country apart. When both his parents are thrown into prison, he is left to look after his four younger siblings on his own, juggling daily life, odd jobs, school exams and concert stages, determined to follow his dream.

Born in 1997 in Uvira, Kivu (DRC), Fariala Alolea Albert arrived as a child in the Central African Republic, where his parents had sought refuge due to the war. He began singing at a very early age. In 2013, he recorded his very first track and hit, *Je Suis Élève*, and adopted his stage name: *Rafiki - Rh20*. He discovered filmmaking in 2017 during a documentary course organised by Ateliers Varan in Bangui. Alongside his economics studies at the University of Bangui, he directed *We, Students!* a feature-length documentary selected for the 2022 Berlinale Panorama section which won numerous awards in festivals (two awards at Cinéma du Réel in Paris, and awards in Milan, Tarifa, Lisbon, Carthage, Fespaco). *Congo Boy* is his first feature film.

Prishtina, Kosovo, late 1990s. As war looms and ethnic tensions escalate, 13-year-old Dua struggles to find her place among her peers and within her changing body. After an incident shakes her community, she becomes a target herself and bonds with a fearless girl, Maki, who draws her toward an unexpected form of resistance. Between the daily violence and the growing threat of exile, there is little room for quiet awakenings.

Blerta Basholli is a Kosova-born writer and director known for her realist visual style exploring social and gender issues. During the war, she took refuge in North Macedonia and Germany. Her early works include short films *Mirror, Mirror...* (2006), *Gjakova 726* (2009) and *Lena & Me* (2011), awarded at many international festivals. In 2011, Blerta Basholli returned to her hometown of Prishtina, Kosovo, where she worked as an assistant director, producer and director. Her debut feature film *Hive* (2021) premiered at the Sundance Film Festival, where it made history by winning the Grand Jury Prize, the Directing Award, and the Audience Award in the World Cinema Dramatic Competition, the first film ever to sweep all three awards in that category. The film has since been sold in over 50 territories worldwide. *Dua* is her second feature.

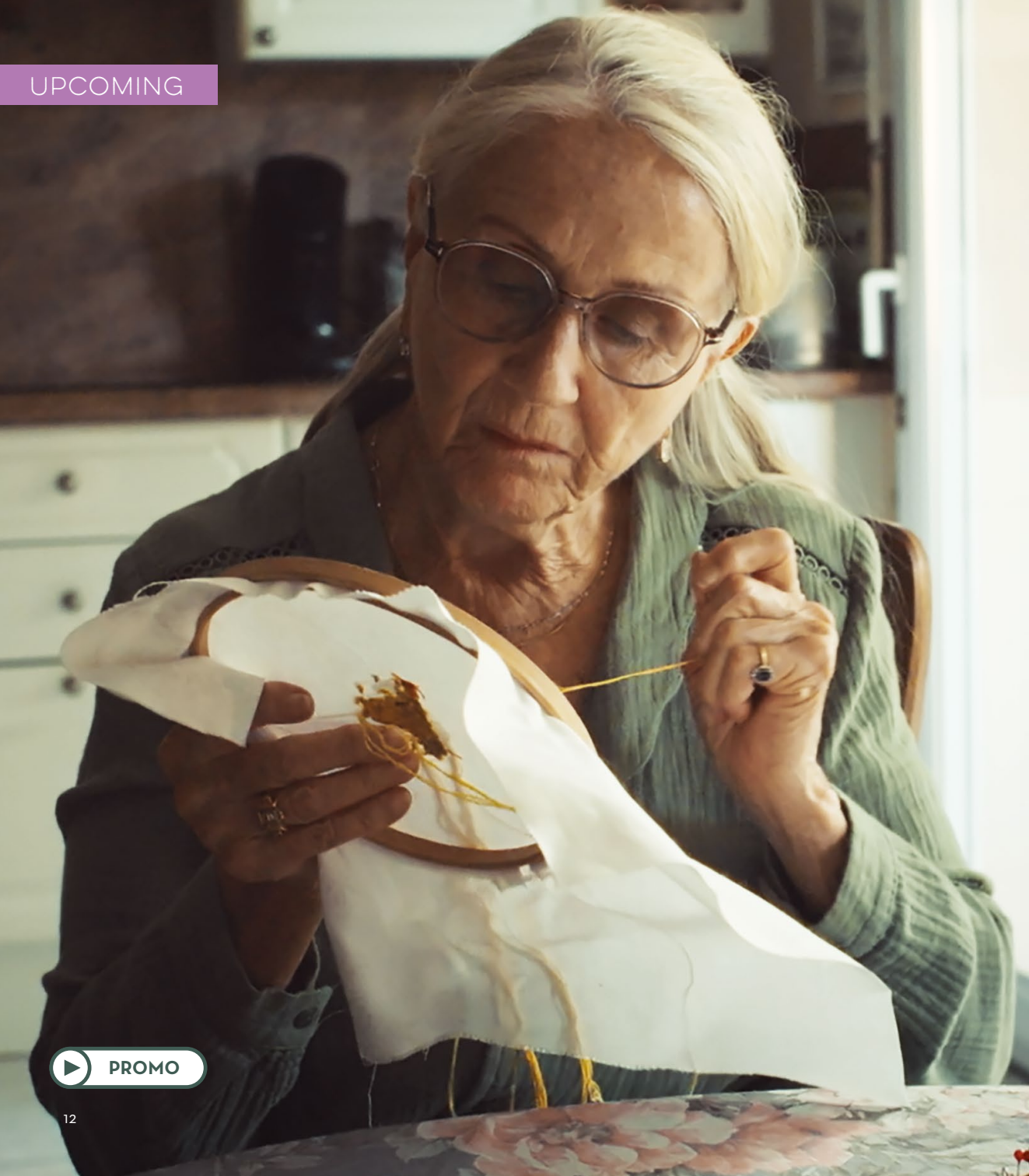

ORDINARY WOMEN

BY DOMINIQUE CABRERA

Both in their seventies, Simone and Jeannine are friends and neighbours. Together, they attend an embroidery club, a shared ritual against loneliness. Simone, cheerful and energetic, is put to the test by the imposed arrival of a young home care worker and the unbearable remarks of a woman in their circle. Jeannine, growing increasingly silent, begins a new personal embroidery, letting herself be carried away by the thread of her past.

Dominique Cabrera is a French director whose work blends fiction and documentary. With nearly thirty projects selected at Cannes, Berlinale, Toronto or Locarno, her cinema is defined by an intimate political engagement, largely influenced by her life, family, and Algerian-French background. Key works include *The Other Shore* (1997) and *Nadia And The Hippos* (1999), both selected at the Cannes Film Festival. *Tomorrow And Again Tomorrow*, *Journal 1995* (1997) is the first documentary of her autobiographical series which include *Ranger Les Photos* (2009), *Grandir (Oh Happy Days!)* (2013), or *Mensch* (2023). Recently, she directed *La Jetée: The Fifth Shot* (2024), an acclaimed documentary essay about *La Jetée* by Chris Marker and her own family history. *Ordinary Women* is her latest feature film, starring H  l  ne Vincent and Yolande Moreau.

LIFE OF AN ETOILE

BY JAMES BORT

Dorothee Gilbert has danced for 25 years at the Paris Opera and is now entering her final season. Her body is beginning to fail her, yet her art has never been greater. This final year takes us inside the world's most legendary ballets, through the iconic roles she has embodied and into the most private corners of a life shaped entirely by dance. *Life of an Étoile* is the portrait of a woman giving all she has left and asking, for the first time, who she is without the dance.

James Bort is a French photographer and film director whose work explores performance, identity and the body. He has collaborated with leading luxury brands including Dior, Cartier, Chanel and Hermès, creating both photographic campaigns and films.

His longstanding relationship with dance began with *Danse(s)* (2011). In 2015, he collaborated with choreographer Benjamin Millepied at the Paris Opera, creating *Étoiles*, a series of portraits of the company's Étoiles, published as a book and exhibited at the Opéra Bastille.

In 2017, he directed *Rise Of A Star*, starring Dorothee Gilbert and Catherine Deneuve, selected at the Tribeca Film Festival and shortlisted for the Academy Awards®. *Life Of An Etoile* his first feature documentary.

Bouchra, raised in a mausoleum dedicated to the saint Sidi Sardi, is confronted by a hostile imam who wants to turn her family home into a mosque. Her life is turned upside down when she meets Ahmed, a cameraman willing to help her make a film about the saint. This project plunges her into a captivating investigation, a saga through Tunisia and the 20th Century, that will shake her deeply-rooted beliefs. An initiation to love, myths and cinema.

Kaouther Ben Hania is a multi Oscar®-nominated Tunisian director who constantly explores the boundaries between fiction and documentary. In 2021, Tunisia was represented at the Academy Awards® for the first time with the nomination of Ben Hania's *The Man Who Sold His Skin* competing for Best International Feature Film. In 2023, her documentary *Four Daughters* premiered in Competition in Cannes and received numerous prestigious awards before its nomination for Best Documentary Academy Award® in 2024. *The Voice of Hind Rajab* premiered in Competition in Venice in 2025 where it won the Silver Lion Grand Jury Prize. In January 2026, it became the third film by Kaouther Ben Hania to earn a nomination for an Academy Award®. All her other films have premiered at prestigious festivals including Cannes, Venice, AFT, Los Angeles, Locarno, IDFA, Hot Docs Toronto. *You Shall Not Make an Image* will be her seventh feature film.

**FREDERICK WISEMAN'S COMPLETE FILMOGRAPHY
NOW AVAILABLE DIGITALLY 33 BRAND-NEW RESTORATIONS**

For the first time, all of Frederick Wiseman's 45 films are now available in digital format. 33 of these films, originally shot on 16mm and only available on film, have now been restored in 4K. Using original 16mm negatives and sound elements, the materials were personally reviewed and approved by Wiseman. This five year project - a collaboration between Zipporah Films, the Library of Congress, Harvard Film Archive, DuArt Labs and Goldcrest Post Production - will allow greater availability of Wiseman's work, removing barriers to allow access to wider audiences.

Beginning in the fall of 2024, comprehensive Wiseman retrospectives have started to screen at Centre Pompidou in Paris, American Cinematheque in Los Angeles, Film at Lincoln Center in New York, BFI Southbank in London, and other venues across the world.
